If we could plainly define abstract values such as Love, Faith and Art, my description of art would be the following:


Art is a language of time.




The glasses worn by every portrayed individual represent the metaphor of "vision" as the ability to view new and different horizons that can be reached and shared as a "collective heritage".






Every age has its contemporary art, that's because art carries the history and the sign of its time.

Leaving a trace with spray paint is a form of obscene pollution that's both rewarding and shameful, an ambiguous feeling that stems from the ancient fault and its antithesis, resting together inside each one of us.






